

Beat Burns, 29-12

Red Raiders Win First Road Game

South Point's Red Raiders completed their 1969 grid campaign with their first road victory, a 29-12 triumph over Burns Bulldogs there last night.

The victory squared the season's record for the Red Raiders at five wins and five losses.

Danny Clawson scored two of the South Point touchdowns, one on a run and the other on a pass from Rick Cherry. The latter added a third TD and the other Raider tally came on a dash by Ronnie Boyles.

The Raiders held only an 8-6 lead at halftime, but added the three insurance scores after intermission.

South Point took the lead in the first period, on an eight yard scoring pitch from Cherry to Clawson. Cherry also passed to Don Davis for a two-point conversion and an early 8-0 lead.

Burns scored late in the first half, after the Raiders stopped the home forces for three downs inside the three yard line. Quarterback Ronnie London tallied the touchdown on a one-yard

sneak on fourth down. The extra point was missed as the half ended at 8-6.

Clawson swept into the end zone on a 10-yard maneuver after a pitchout from Cherry for the South Point TD in the third period, and Joey Metts place-kicked the first of three extra points.

Boyles countered for the winners on a 29 yard jaunt early in the fourth period, and Metts' kick boosted South Point into a 22-6 lead.

Burns trimmed the margin on a 26-yard run by London, but South Point came back with the final touchdown, a 17yard run by quarterback Cherry and Metts converted again for the final margin.
