

Red Raiders impressive in win over Cherryville

CHERRYVILLE—Scott Crawford and South Point lived up to their pre-season ratings here last night, completely demolishing Cherryville, 39-0, in the 3-A Southwest Conference opener for both schools.

Crawford, a junior speedster, scored on runs of 26, 25, 40 and 29 yards and was by far the game's outstanding player. He gained 201 yards rushing in 16 carries.

South Point scored the first three times it got its hands on the football while Cherryville could never get an offensive attack going against the Red Raider defense. The Ironmen had minus 20 yards rushing for the game.

The Raiders drove the opening kickoff 66 yards with fullback Danny Clawson scoring from the five with 7:21 left in the first quarter. Joey Metz kicked the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

South Point added three more touchdowns in the second period to take a 2-0 lead into the dressing room at halftime.

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THE SECOND time South Point got the pigskin, the Raiders marched 67 yards in 11 plays, Crawford covering the final 26 yards and Metz adding the PAT for a 14-0 advantage.

On the ensuing kickoff, Jeff Auten of the Raiders recovered

an Ironmen fumble on the Cherryville 30 and on the second play Crawford went 25 yards for a 20-0 lead.

South Point's final first half score, making the margin 26-0, came following Doug Froneberger's fumble recovery on the Ironmen 40. Crawford went the distance on the first play.

The Raiders, substituting freely in the third period, were held scoreless but Jim Biggerstaff's charges were at it again in the fourth quarter.

On the second play of the final

chapter, Crawford went 29 yards and Metz added the point-after for a 33-0 lead. Late in the game, South Point marched 80 yards with Holbrook transfer Randy Stutts scoring from 13 yards out.

Clawson was the leading defensive player for South Point while Yates Mauney headed the Cherryville defensive charge.

South Point, recognized as a title threat in the SWC, goes to Lincolnton next week, while Cherryville travels to Dallas for a non-conference game.

Stewart sparks Pharr Yarns win

JONES BEACH, N. Y. — Cookie Stewart's two-run single in the sixth inning erased a 7-5 deficit and sparked Pharr Yarns to a 13-10 victory over Atlanta, Ga., here Friday in the opening round of the National Industrial Slowpitch Softball Tournament.

The victory sends the Reds into a 12:15 game today against the winner of the Detroit-Pittsburgh game, which was played late last night.

After Stewart's single and an error put the Reds on top in the sixth, 8-7, the Pharr team broke the game open with five runs in the top of the seventh. Two-run doubles by Mac Richardson and David Johnson sparked the rally.

"A win is a win," commented Coach Doug McDonald, "but I don't feel like we played up to our potential. Our players might have been pressing too hard. Butch Stewart was the man of the hour and saved us."

Mac Richardson, though he traveled most of the day, was the Reds' leading hitter with 3 for 4. Four other players, including Stewart, had two hits each.

Today's 12:15 game will be taped and played back over Station WCGC in Belmont at 1:15. If the Reds win, they'll play again at 6:15.

"We need six straight to clinch this thing," said McDonald. "We're off and running."
