

Hannon, Crawford lead Raiders 8-6 victory

SALISBURY — South Point's Red Raiders made a 84-yard touchdown pass from Bill Hannon to Scott Crawford and Hannon's two-point conversion run stand up here last night for an 8-6 non-conference victory over South Rowan.

The Raiders, now 3-0 overall, scored in the second period for an 8-0 halftime lead, then stopped a two-point conversion run following South Rowan's third period touchdown pass from Dennis Stamey to Freddie Weathers.

South Point trailed the hosts in yards rushing, 192 to 69, but Hannon hit on six of 13 passes for 119 yards. South Rowan had only 25 yards passing.

Crawford, a junior, was the game's top rusher with 91 yards in 13 carries and he also caught three passes for 79 more yards. Crawford had one run of 47 yards during the second period as the Raiders marched to the South Rowan 18 before losing the ball on downs.

A fumble recovery by William Bowens at the South Rowan 36 set up South Point's touchdown. Hannon tossed a touchdown pass to Dean Ivester but it was called back on a penalty. After the next two plays saw the Raiders lose to the 48, Hannon hooked up with Crawford on the scoring play. Crawford caught the pass on the 20 and then outran the field.

LATE IN the third period, South Rowan began a drive on its own 29 following a punt. They moved to the South Point 12, and on a fourth down pass, Ivester appeared to slap the ball away from the intended receiver. But the ball fell right into the hand of Weathers for the TD.

Allen Klutz, South Rowan's top rusher with 65 yards in 12

carries, then tried to run for the two-point conversion but was stopped.

On the ensuing kickoff, Crawford lost his footing at the Rai-
