

Big Red rubs out Chase 42-0, continues unbeaten

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South Point's unbeaten Raiders (6-0) rolled easily over out-manned Chase last night at home, 42-0, setting up another big one next week with R-S Central. That contest will be the Raiders homecoming.

Don Davis was back in form last night, with a pair of runs, while Scott Crawford also tallied twice. The elusive Crawford was his usual spectacular self, especially on punt returns, when he turned ultra-elusive against the Chase defenders.

Junior Bill Hannon connected on several long passes early in the game, including a 39 yarder to Ronnie Boyles for a TD that sent the Raiders into a 14-0 first quarter lead.

An early bomb, from Han-

non to Jerry Conard, covering 34 yards, went from the South Point 42 to the Trojan 24 to set up the first Raider score.

After the strike to Conard down the middle, Crawford carried to the 21. On the next play, he broke a tackle at the line of scrimmage and scampered into the end zone, this coming with an even 10 minutes left in the first quarter.

Joey Metz came on to boot the first of six points after and the route was on.

The pass to Boyles came with 7:08 left in the quarter, after the stingy Big Red defense had stopped the Trojans and forced them to punt to the 42. The pass was tipped by Roger Powell, into the hands of Boyles who caught the ball at full speed and sped down the sidelines to paydirt.

ON THE ENSUING kickoff, the Trojans mounted their longest drive of the night, moving from their own 31 to the Red Raider 20 before they ran out of steam.

A pass interference call against the Raiders helped the drive considerably, although the Trojans did manage two first downs of their own.

On a third down pass into the end zone, Warren Nesbit made a fine defensive play batting the ball away from the would-be receiver.

In the second quarter Davis scored the first of his two TDs, a 10-yard jaunt off tackle, which saw the gutty senior break three tackles before reaching paydirt. The Metz kick made the score 21-0 at the 5:48 mark before the half.

Forty-seven seconds later the Raiders were on the board again, this time on a 15-yard fumble recovery and return by 200-pound senior Randy Walden.

The bobbie and resulting score was set up by a jarring tackle on Trojan quarterback, Tony Fowler, by Danny Clawson, who had been on the ailing list for three weeks.

In the second half the second and third units did most of the work, although the Raiders did put two more scores on the board during the third period.

Davis and Crawford each added a TD in that period, with Davis going in from 11-yards out and Crawford taking it in standing up from the four.

Davis did a nifty job in out-racing two defenders to the end zone flag, while Crawford almost "walked" into the end zone, with a couple of Trojans hanging on.

CRAWFORD had 70 yards in eight carries, while Boyles picked up 54 yards in seven carries.

Hannon hit on three of six passes before turning things over to David Bernhill.

Defensively, Davis was a terror to the Chase backfield all night, especially on passing situations, during which he collared the Trojan passer several times.
