

Raiders ramble by Cherryville

Scott Crawford, the South Point flash, was up to his old tricks last night, scoring three times as South Point's powerful Red Raiders blanked Cherryville 46-0 at home.

Crawford set the theme for the night before an enthusiastic crowd, grabbing a Cherryville punt on his own 20 with 7:12 to go in the first quarter, breaking a couple of tackles, reversing his field and dashing down the sidelines for the score.

He also scored the second Raider TD in the second quarter, scampering seven yards, capping a 60 yard drive in 10 plays to put the Big Red out front 13-0, following Jimmy Stowe's point after kick.

With four minutes left in the half, Jim Forbes recovered a Cherryville fumble at the Ironmen 31, and two plays later Crawford was again in the end zone at the end of a 20-yard pass from quarterback Bill Hannon.

But the play was nullified by a penalty. Not to be denied, South Point scored several plays later, with Crawford again going in, this time at the end of a five yard run. The kick was no good and South Point held a 19-0 halftime lead.

The Raiders, coached by Jim Biggerstaff, padded the lead in the second half while the rugged Raider defense held the Ironmen, under first year coach Jerry Carpenter, were held to no first downs and but nine yards rushing.

Cherryville moved across midfield only once, that coming

during the second half, but that was snuffed out by a fumble.

Late in the game, Hannon hit Mike McWhirter with a 22 yard scoring strike and with just seconds in the game, sophomore passing sensation Butch Harris came in, hitting William with a 35-yard pass to account for the final points.

For the game, South Point racked up 259 yards along the ground, 124 of which were accounted for by Crawford in 16 carries.

Cloniger roamed the field for 279 net yards rushing and scored three touchdowns in the process. The Blue Devils amassed 353 yards rushing as a team to go with 19 through the air for a total of 382 yards rushing.

Stanley now boasts a 2-0 record after opening last week with a 40-0 victory over Stan T. Foard.

The blue Devils jumped off to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter and padded it with two more scores in the second quarter for an 18-0 halftime advantage.
