

South Point coasts 42-0

Big Red blitzes 'Pack

The Big Red Machine keeps right on rolling along.

South Point's Red Raiders blitzed Lincolnton's Wolfpack 42-0 in their homecoming game last night for their fifth straight victory on the season.

It was also South Point's 16th victory in their last 17 games going into a Friday night road game at Chase.

Scott Crawford, the county and area's leading point-producer scored 20 points last night on three touchdowns and a two-point conversion, giving him 62 points on the season in five games.

South Point has now scored 179 points in five games while the rock-ribbed defense of Coach Jim Biggerstaff has limited the foes to just 28 markers.

South Point took the opening kickoff last night and marched 70 yards to paydirt, Crawford scoring from the 19 and Dennis Grier kicking the first of his four points from placement.

Later in the period, quarterback Bill Hannon on a keeper ran for 22 yards to the South Point 39, then pitched the ball back to Crawford who went the rest of the way completing a 78-yard play.

Grier's pass interception stopped a Wolfpack drive in the second quarter at the South Point 12. The Raiders were penalized back to the 7 and then the Big Red put on another long march, this one going for 93 yards.

With Dean Ivester and Crawford running well in the drive, the touchdown came about when Hannon passed 27 yards to end Doug Froneberger.

The Big Red was out front at the half, 21-0 and completely in charge of things.

But South Point wasn't through, scoring 21 points in the third quarter before turning it over to reserves.

LINCOLNTON'S Larry Easter fumbled and Grier was the man on the spot again, returning the fumble to the Wolfpack 35. On

the next play, Hannon, who passed for 169 yards for the night, hit Crawford on a 35-yard scoring pitch.

After Grier's placement, it moved to 28-0. Jimmy Stowe a few moments later intercepted a John Lawing pass on the Lincolnton 20 and ran it in for the score and Grier's placement missed.

Shortly after the kickoff, the fleet Easter broke loose and rammed 52 yards to the South Point five. On the next play, Grier recovered a Fred Dalrymple fumble at the four.

After South Point was penalized to the two, Crawford gained to the nine, from which point Hannon hit Froneberger on the South Point 35 and Froneberger ran the remaining distance to glory-land.

Hannon then passed to Crawford for the two-point conversion and South Point closed out its scoring.

Crawford had 163 yards in 13 carries. He had 163 of them in

the first half on 10 totes.

Dalrymple of the Wolfpack gained 91 yards in 11 carries. The South Point front four put all kinds of pressure on Lincolnton, padicularly ends Danny Clawson and Mike McWhirter.

South Point had 487 yards in total offense, gaining 318 yards on the ground and 169 more through the air.
