

# Red Raiders

## rip Trojans,

### 33-7 score

HARRIS — Stung by a Chase touchdown and behind for the first time this season, South Point's Red Raiders rallied here last night to hand the Trojans a 33-7 Southwest 3-A Conference football setback.

The victory, accomplished primarily with some second half heroics, was South Point's sixth straight of the year. The Big Red, ranked fourth among the state's Class 3-A schools, has now won 17 of its last 18 games.

Then went over the 200-point mark in beating the fired-up Trojans, now having scored 212 points on the year and having surrendered 35.

And senior halfback speedster Scott Crawford went over the 100-point mark in just his sixth game by scoring four of the Big Red's touchdowns Friday.

Crawford with his first four-touchdown night has now tallied 106 points in six contests and leads the county and area in scoring. He carried the ball 15 times for 116 yards Friday, giving him 901 yards rushing on the year for a 9.2 average per carry.

It was Crawford who got the Big Red off to a 6-0 lead in the opening quarter. South Point on the opening kickoff marched 65 yards to score, with Crawford going the final 10.

SOUTH POINT was then stung in the second quarter when on a fourth and inches play at the 40, the Red Raiders fumbled. The ball was plucked out of mid-air by P. J. Byers of the Trojans and he raced 30 yards to paydirt. Following the extra point, which was successful, Chase held a 7-6 lead and South Point trailed for the first time all year.

But South Point rebounded on the passing arm of quarterback Bill Hannon. Hannon hit end Doug Froneberger on a 60-yard scoring pitch and the Big Red held the slender 13-7 halftime margin.

The second half turned South Point's way as Crawford tallied three touchdowns.

He scored from the one in the third quarter following a 65-yard drive, and Hannon on two option plays gained 16 and 24 yards to help keep the push alive.

Later in the quarter, Crawford went over from the eight on a 62-yard drive and in the fourth quarter went nine yards for another six-pointer.

Jimmy Stowe kicked one extra point and Dennis Grier two to close out the scoring.

Hannon carried the ball nine times for 90 yards and Dean Ivester eight times for 86 yards for South Point, which had 302 yards rushing and 153 more passing.

"I was pleased with our comeback," said Jim Biggerstaff of the Raiders. "We really came back after being behind for the first time and we scored two plays after Chase had scored."

"I was real disappointed in our first half but pleased with the way we played in the second half."

"I thought our end play was outstanding on defense."

Leading the end play were William Clark, Mike McWhirter and Danny Clawson.
