

Raiders streak by Burns, 42-13

South Point came up with a 28-point second quarter against Burns at Fallston last night and went on to a 42-13 Southwest 3-A Conference victory over the winless Burns Bulldogs.

It gave South Point its first unbeaten regular season since 1953. The Big Red finished with a perfect 10-0 mark and 21st victory in their last 22 games.

The Raiders' next opponent will be a playoff foe and it will be Lincolnton in Lincolnton next Friday. Lincolnton swatted Kings Mountain 43-18 last night for their seventh league win in nine games and fifth straight overall.

Shelby was upset by East Rutherford 13-12 and knocked out of the race with a final record of 6-2-1. South Point played one of its best games against Lincolnton during the regular season, capturing a 42-0 victory.

Burns shocked South Point with a first quarter score and held a 7-0 lead. The Bulldogs drove 82 yards on the opening kickoff, with Ronnie London passing to Mike Goolsby from 22 yards out and the touchdown and London kicked the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

But South Point, now having scored 369 points on the season and having surrendered 54, came up with a strong second quarter with 28 points.

They did the damage in the span of 10 minutes and 57 seconds.

After a 95-yard touchdown run by Curtis Moss was called back because of clipping, county and area leading scorer Scott Crawford went 50 yards for the score but the point-after missed and it was 7-6, Burns.

SOUTH POINT'S second score came when they drove 66 yards with Hannon passing 34 yards to Mike McWhirter with 6:58 left and Hannon ran for the two-point conversion making it 14-7, Raiders.

A pass interception by Moss at midfield set up the next score,

with Hannon going up the middle from 22 yards out and Stowe kicking the extra point making it 21-7. That came with 2:02 left.

Dean Ivester's pass interception later set up his one-yard run with 46 seconds left and Stowe again converted for a 28-7 Raider halftime lead.

McWhirter, Tony Beale, Jim Forbes and Stowe were outstanding on defense for the Big Red of Jim Biggerstaff.
