# Raiders blank Burns 26-0;

### Shelby next in playoffs

South Point's Red Raiders. held to an 8/0 lead at halftime by a stubborn Burns Bulldogs team, came to life in the second half at Lineberger Stadium last night to finish the regular sea-son on a bright note with a 26-0 blanking of the invaders.

Frustrated with 0-for-7 in the passing game in the first half, sophomore quarterback Doug Davis got cranked up in the fourth quarter, passing for two scores to help the Big Red fin-

ish at 8-1-1.

The Big Red of fourth-year mentor Jim Biggerstaff will now enter 3-A playoff action next week, entertaining Shelby on Friday night at 8 p.m. Shelby, third-ranked in the state's. 3-A ranks, closed out unbeaten last night at 10-0 with a 29-6 win over East Rutherford.

In their first meeting in Shelby, the Golden Lions captured a 28-12 decision. South Point, in beating Burns, won its 31st game in 35 outings, with its only losses coming to Shelby and two ties.

IN THE second quarter Friday. The Big Red marched 65 yards after Dennis Grier recovered a fumble at the Raider 35. Bobby Mann got loose on a 14yard run during the drive and sophomore standout Jerry Auten romped for a 13-yarder.

Auten scored the touchdown on a one-yard run. On the extra point, a high snap from center forced Grier to run with the ball and he bulled into the end zone for the two-pointer and the Raiders held a non-too-comfortable 8-0 lead at the half.

In the third quarter, Burns was backed up with fourth down on its own 18. The snap from center went over punter Harvey Horne's head. He chased it into the end zone, picked it up, but managed to get it out to just the two-yard line.

On the first play, Wayne Fe-well went over for a 14-0 lead as Jimmy Stowe missed the

extra point.

Davis then began to hit his targets in the fourth quarter. In the first half, a quick Burns rush and a good defensive secondary performance helped to keep Doug at bay.

A fumble recovery by senior guard standout Jim Forbes at the Burns 45 set up the third touchdown. Auten picked up 14 yards, Davis hit Tim Williams for nine and Auten ran for 12

more to put the ball on the 10. \* \* \*

DAVIS ON a flair pass hit halfback Robert Adams in the flat and Adams was home free into the end zone for a 20-0 Raider lead at the 4:09 mark as the point-after again missed.

From there, Davis on the first play hit Tim Williams for 61 yards and the touchdown with Williams making a beautiful run by and around defenders. That last touchdown came with 1 45 left in the game.

Burns led in first downs. 16-12, but South Point held Burns to just 54'yards rushing while the Auten-led Big Red had 163 yards on the ground. The passing was about even, soph Burns quarterback Ricky Sims connecting on 12-of-20 for 139 vards.
