Jerry Auten scored two touchdowns and gained 106 yards rushing and Butch Rankin added 90-yards rushing and one touchdown for the winners.

The Raiders scored two quick touchdowns

late in the first half for a 14-0 lead at intermission. They scored a pair of second half touchdowns to insure their eighth straight win

Auten started the scoring with 6 20 left before half when he broke off tackle and outraced the KM secondary for 56 yards. Rankin's PAT made it 7-0. Following a short Kings Mountain punt, the Raiders marched 41 yards with Rankin going over from 11 yards out. His PAT made it 14-0 at halftime.

South Point ground out 21 first downs and accumulated 332 yards total offense to 100 by the Mounties.

The Raiders travel to Burns Next Friday night and are odds-on favorites to win there and at home the following week against North Gaston to wind up the regular season undefeated.
