Raiders bumped by Watauga

BOONE — Watauga's football Pioneers shocked the North Carolina 3-A prep football world for the second straight week here last might, downing South Point in a penetration playoff after the regulation game had ended at 8-8 in the WNCHSA semifinals.

Watauga, upset winner over Lenoir last Friday, next week advances into a Friday contest against the winner of the Mooresville-Salisbury game played last night.

After the regulation game had ended at 8-8 Watauga was given the ball at the SP ten-yard line and scored in three plays. Harvey Vance passed to Harvey Cole for the TD on third and six. Gary Yates ran for the two-point conversion.

Wayne Fewell then scored on the first play for the Raiders, going ten yards wide right, but quarterback Doug Davis was tackled on the option play trying for the two-point conversion.

Even if South Point had scored the two points. Watauga would have won on total yardage. The Pioneers had 173 total yards for the game to South Point's 103.

After being outplayed in the first half and most of the third quarter. South Point came back in the final stanza

The Raiders' Kevin Davis fumbled a snapfrom center on a punt, and he was downed at the Raider 11-yard line. The Pioneers then drove to the two, where they had fourth and a foot to go, but a penalty put them back to the seven, where a pass fell incomplete. South Point then moved from its own seven to the Watauga six before being stopped. The key play in the drive was a 49-yard pass play from Doug Davis to Tim Williams which put the ball on the Watauga 35.

South Point had a chance to win the game when Mark Morris recovered a fumble at the Watauga 39.

The drive ended when Doug Davis passed to Fletcher Williams on the Watauga six, just short of a first down, and Dennis Grier's 23-yard field goal attempt was wide left.

The score remained tied at 8-8 for the remainder of the game and the Pioneers wrapped it up in the penetration playoff.

WATAUGA DOMINATED the first half, gaining 74 yards rushing to seven for South Point.

Gary Yates scored the Watauga touchdown in the second quarter on a four-yard run which climaxed a 35-yard drive, and Yates ran over for the two-point conversion, making it 8-0 Pioneers, and that's the way the score remained until the end of the half.
