The longest gain by the visitors from the line of scrimmage was six yards, on a run by Leel-better and Ledbetter's pass to Robert Barnette. Keeter was the workhorse for the visitors, carrying 17 times for only 30 yards.

Although sooring only three times the Raiders, completly, dominated the statistics-picking up 215 yards rushing and adding 142 through the air.

Davis hit on time of 21 passes, but an alert Hilliopper secondary, led by Keeter picked off three of Doug's passes.
