Painter, SP put blast on North Gaston, 55-0

South Point's Red Raiders appear to be picking up momentum as the Southwestern 3-A Conference football race heads into its final three crucial weeks of play.

The Big Red blitzed North Gaston's Wildcats for four first quarter touchdowns Friday night at North Gaston Stadium and went on to rout

the Wildcats, 55-0.

In a so-called rebuilding year, Coach Jim Biggerstaff's Big Red team has already won one more game than in '75, and it is currently embroiled in a four-way tie for first brightest was 170-pound

The Big Red is 5-1 in SWC play and 6-1 overall, the non-conference win coming over Ashbrook. Previously unbeaten Kings Mountain was felled by Shelby Friday night at Shelby, 20-0, which means that Kings Mountain, South Point, Shelby, and Chase are all tied for the number one position with 5-1 marks

The Raiders entertain Mountain in a big game at Lineberger Stadium next Friday.

South Point had many standouts against the 'Cats Friday, but the biggest red star who shined the

halfback Mitch Painter, who took over the backfield position vacated when junior Steve Davis was injured against Ashbrook.

Painter made SP fans forget Davis and put himself on their memory list. Although Dennis Isles was the game's Although Dennis Isies was the game's leading rusher with 97 yards in 12 carries while seeing limited action, Painter picked up 66 yards in eight carries, scored on a 14-yard run for SP's second touchdown, intercepted two North Gaston passes from his limbacking position and recovered. linebacking position, and recovered a 'Cat fumble

The home team had little to cheer about after the opening kickoff when the Big Red marched 43 yards in seven plays after Fernandez Grier had returned the ball from the SP 10 to the 'Cat 43. Quarterback Joe Shepherd went over from the five at the 8:27 mark and the first of Karl Witzke's five successful kicks made it

After driving 50 yards in just three plays to score again at the 5:54 mark with Painter running the final 14 yards, Grier broke the game open when he returned a Wildcat punt 75

yards to paydirt.

Painter's pass interception gave SP a good shot at the 'Cat 12 when he returned the interception from the Cat 40. After a penalty put the ball on the 16, Shepherd hit Jerry Clubb in the end zone among two 'Cat defenders at the 1:59 mark and Isles ran the two-point conversion for a 28-0 SP

Painter's fumble recovery at the 'Cat 20 enabled the Raiders to score in

Cat 20 enabled the Raiders to score in two plays early in the second quarter, with Isles going over from the six.

Biggerstaff used his second team from the 11:36 mark on, with the Raiders holding a 35-0 lead. The Raiders holding a 35-0 lead. The Raiders marched 62 yards in 10 plays the first time they had the ball in the third quarter, with Grier going over from the three at the 5:13 mark.

North Gaston moved from its 32 to the Raider 10 for its longest march of

the Raider 10 for its longest march of the night, but on a fourth down and seven play, that man Painter was on the scene again, intercepting Greg Russell's pass at the 'Cat six-yard line and returning it to the NG 43. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Shepherd hit Rick Lawing with a three-yard scoring pass, making it

48-0.

The final Red Raider touchdown came on a short 27-yard drive following a 15-yard penalty against the 'Cats for interfering with the receiver on a punt, and sophomore quarterback Robbie Suggs pushed in from the two at the 8:20 mark.

The 'Cats moved from their 47 to the Raider 12, but a fourth down pass was intercepted by Randy Moss in the end

sone.

SP completely dominated the game, handing the 'Cats their worst defeat in their four meetings. The Big Red had 251 yards rushing and 70 more passing for 321 yards total offense. NG had only 31 yards rushing and 93 passing.

With 5:39 to go in the third period, Buff threw 18 yards to Devine. Wayne Patterson tallied the two pointer, but victorious Chase outfit, after threatening three times in the third quarter without a score, hit the boards for 14 points in the fourth quarter for the 37-15 final.
