Chase touchdown stops Red Raiders

The Chase Trojans put six points on the board Friday night at South Point's Lineberger Stadium and that was enough to hand the Red Raiders a 6-2 defeat in a Southwestern 3-A Conference game.

The damaging blow came on a 71yard pass play featuring the brother
combination of end Rodney and
quarterback Chuck McSwain. As
Chuck McSwain was rolling on a passrun option play, he spotted Rodney
and promptly fired the strike to him
for the game's only touchdown. The
extra point kick was low, and Chase
carried a 6-0 lead into the locker room
at intermission.

The Red Raider rushing attack was

only able to net 49 yards rushing for the game and 17 yards through the air on three Jeff Williams completions. The equally strong Red Raider defense held the Trojan rushing attack to 74 yards on the ground and another 82 in the air, with the 71yarder being the difference in the game.

South Point's safety came in the fourth period with a little over two minutes remaining in the game as Al James stepped out of the end zone with the ball, awarding the Red Raiders their only score in the defensive battle.

The Trojans are 3-0 in conference play, while South Point's record dropped to 2-1.
