West Meck beats South Point 20-14

CHARLOTTE — A fourthquarter touchdown by West Mecklenburg quarterback Derrick McGowan on a fourth-down keeper play spelled doom for the South Point Red Raiders.

In fact, McGowan did all of his team's scoring as the Indians slipped by the Raiders 20-14.

For most of the game, particularly the first half, South Point had its offense in gear. Senior standout running back, Tonja Watson, who missed last week's season opener because of a knee injury, was in fine form as he rushed for 112 first-half yards and scored both of his team's touchdowns.

But in the third period, Watson began limping after a short gainer, and saw limited action the rest of the night. He finished the game with 126 yards on 19 carries.

South Point took the opening kickoff and drove 72 yards in 10 plays, with Watson scoring from 17 yards out. Mike Dudko kicked the first of his two extra points.

West Meck scored on its first possession, going the same number of yards in 17 plays, with McGowan carrying three yards for the score on fourth-and-goal.

Watson put the Raiders ahead 14-6 with 4:38 left in the first half on a 4-yard run that capped a 68yard drive.

The Indians scored with 1:15 left before halftime on a 1-yard run by McGowan, but failed to convert a two-point try and trailed 14-12.

The Raider defense, which struggled through the first half, did a fine job of holding the Indians in the second half until McGowan got the winning score with 3:07 left in the game.

The TD came shortly after South Point quarterback Chris Cornelius fumbled with West Mecklenburg recovering on the 30.

The Indians moved upfield, but faced fourth-and-four when McGowan slipped through the defense for the winning score.
