Kevin Armstrong led the Hunter Huss offense, rushing for 189 yards on 18 carries and caught one pass for 31 yards, the longest pass of the night for the Huskies.

The Huskies spotted East Mecklenburg a 14-0 lead in the first quarter when, after Hamer's touchdown, Brad Causey intercepted a Benny Capps pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown.

Huss scored its only touchdown with 5:26 left in the game when Capps hit Tony Collins on a 17-yard touchdown pass.
