South Point 6 Burns 7

FALLSTON — South Point's Red Raiders were on the verge of winning their first football game of the season here Friday night, but a 47-yard punt return on the first play of the fourth period by Scotty Haynes and the extra point conversion by Sam Beam sent the visitors down to their 10th straight loss.

It was the first winless season in South Point's history, or since

1969. The Raiders finished 0-7 in the league and 0-10 overall. The Bulldogs finished at 2-5 in the league and 4-6 overall.

A Raider fumble recovery deep in Burns territory set up South Point's only score of the night, quarterback Chris Cornelius going over from the Burns 1. But a pass play for the two-point conversion failed.

South Point's other deepest penetration was to the Burns 5, but Haynes intercepted a pass in the end zone. The Bulldogs got to the Raider 12 in the third period but fumbled the ball away.

Tailback Keith Robbins, who missed last week's game because of a shoulder injury, picked up 86 yards in 20 carries to lead the Raiders.
