Raiders battle past Wildcats

Tailback trio keys victory by South Point

BELMONT - Three South Point tailbacks - and sophomore Willie Strain in particular - made the difference Friday night as the South Point Red Raiders took a crucial 30-21 Southwestern 3-A Conference victory over North Gaston's Wildcats.

The win raised South Point's league mark to 2-1 and pushed the Raiders' overall record to 4-2. North Gaston fell to 1-2 in the SWC and 2-4 overall.

Strain, a punishing runner who also has speed on his side, scored two touchdowns and picked up 147 of his team's 309 yards rushing.

"It was a good win against a good ballclub." said Raider Coach Jim Biggerstaff, whose team won its first game at home this year. "Strain doesn't play like a sophomore. He had just a super game.

"After the 8-8 halftime score, we would score and they would score. What figured to be a defensive game turned out to be one of offensive bursts. We would always counter when they came back on us."


Coach Bob Patton of North Gaston said his team made too many mistakes - 100 vards in penalties, a lost fumble and an interception - against "a team you can't make mistakes against."

"I was proud of the way our guys fought back, but in the end, we had problems stopping their power running game," Patton said. "They have three of the finest backs in the league.

"We thought we could win right up until the end. It's just that their speed outside and then their crack-back runs against us hurt. They run a strong power game."

Strain gave South Point the lead in the first 1:33 of the game when he broke losse on a 75-yard run. Quarterback Mike Young hit end Mike Pannell for the two-pointer for a quick 8-0 Raider lead.

But that was destined to be the only Raider score of the first half, and quarterback Johnny McCraw of the Wildcats passed 25 yards to back Clay Hendrix with 1:32 remaining in the half and also hit Hendrix on the two-point conver-

sion for the 8-8 halftime tie.

That touchdown was set up by a shanked punt by Pannell, caused by a low snap and onrushing Wildcats. The ball went out of bounds at the Raider 19, and the touchdown came on a third-and-25 play after the Wildcats had been penalized 15 yards for an illegal block.

McCraw would wind up with two touchdown passes on the night and 120 yards through the air. Ralph Hoke scored the other Wildcat touchdown and wound up with 101 yards rushing in 18 carries.

The Raiders drove 40 yards after a fumble recovery at the 8:58

mark of the third period and scored on a 17-yard run by Brian-Pate, another of the South Point tailbacks. Strain kicked the extra point for a 15-8 Raider lead.

The Wildcats came right back, marching 63 yards in 11 plays with Hoke going over from the 1 at the 3:01 mark. McCraw's extra point attempt was wide right, however, leaving South Point with a 15-14

night, went over for the two-point conversion for a 23-14 Raider lead.

The Wildcats then stormed 80 yards in 10 plays, with McCraw hitting Joe Burris on a crucial fourth-down play which covered 18 yards for the score at the 6:36 mark. McCraw's extra-point kick-

made it 23-21.

Right back came the Raiders, who went 75 yards with Floyd racing the final 35 and Strain booting the extra point to make it 30-21.

North Gaston's chances finally ended when Bobby Nichols intercepted McCraw's pass on the Raider 20 and returned it to midfield.
