The Lions, who outgained South Point 371 yards to 121, jumped to a quick 7-0 lead on a six-play, 67-yard drive to start the game. Darryl Davis took a pitch around right end from 6 yards out for the touchdown, with Kenny Pauley

adding the PAT to make it 7-0.

South Point answered immediately as Jamie Boyd took the ensuing kickoff at his own 3, then picked his way through a rash of would-be tacklers before hitting open field at his own 30, racing 97 yards for the touchdown. Willie Strain booted the extra point, tying the game at 7-7.

However, Shelby wasted little

time reasserting itself, getting a 37-yard kickoff return from Travis Manning to the Red Raider 42, where quarterback Chad Holbrook took it in for the score on the next play.

From ther on, the Lions controlled the game.

Three chances to extend the lead went by the board in the first half (two missed field goals and an unsuccessful fake field goal) before the Lions finally added to their lead, scoring on their first possession of the third quarter.

Manning capped that drive with a 6-yard touchdown scamper, upping the margin to 21-7 with 9:07 left in the frame.

South Point, which falls to 0-3-1,

mounted its only offensive threat of the game late in the quarter. The Red Raiders used strong running from Nathan Cloninger to drive to the Shelby 13, but turned the ball over on a fumble by Strain.

Manning carried 17 times for 114 yards and Holbrook added 105 yards on 14 carries to lead Shelby, now 2-1-1. South Point was paced by 55 yards on 12 carries from Strain.
