Mounties ride over Raiders

■ **KINGS MOUNTAIN** — All Kasey Holland needs is a little hole. Just a little one.

And ...

"You give him something a little bit left or a little bit right and he's going to find it," said Kings Mountain coach Dennis Hicks after Holland rushed 13 times for 119 yards and one touchdown leading it to a 29-13 win over visiting South Point.

The Mountaineers led 9-0 and Holland had a little hole. He busted through it for a 61-yard touchdown run giving them a 15-0 advantage with 9:17 to go in the third quarter.

Kings Mountain (2-0, 5-1) eventually increased its lead to 29-0 and beat South Point (0-2, 3-3-1) in every aspect of the game.

"We got whipped bad," Red Raider coach Phil Tate said. "What can you say? We just got whipped. We got whipped in every phase."

Kings Mountain quarter-back Jerry Black rushed five times for 98 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown run. He also added two interceptions.

South Point's downfall?

Five costly turnovers – three fumbles and two interceptions.

And the Mountaineers took full advantage.

"We're definitely pleased with what we saw," Hicks said. "It's really a little more than we anticipated. It's still early. We've got Burns next week and Shelby. We're getting better."

Derek Bowens paced the Red Raiders with 11 carries for 73 yards.

Also, with 4:24 left in the game, South Point's Wes Gibson was injured and had to be taken to Kings Mountain Hospital.

His condition was not known at press time.

Next week, South Point will host R-S Central and Kings Mountain travels to Burns.
