Green Wave shuts down South Point

GASTONIA — After watching Ashbrook dismantle a previously unbeaten South Point squad 34-3 Friday night, it's difficult to decide which side of the ball is most responsible for the Green Wave's dominance this season.

Take the offense, for example. Ashbrook now has rolled up 101 points in three games. Seniors Tetrice Cook and Trivice Sadler have taken turns scorching opposing defenses, combining for 10 touchdowns.

Defensively, the three points scored by the Red Raiders — on a last-second field goal from Philliph Wright — were the first allowed by the Green Wave defens

this season.

It tempered the jubilation on the Ashbrook sideline, albeit briefly, despite the lopsided victo-

"We have a lot of seniors on this defense," said Ashbrook's Hugh Grant.

"We play every down out there like the score is tied. It huns that they got three points."

That's about the only pain South Point inflicted on the Green Wave, as Ashbrook took advantige of some poor tackling by the led Raiders to strike for the early tead.

On the third play from scrimmage, Sadler took a reverse handoff from Cook and headed towards the Raider sideline. Seemingly trapped between the line and a wall of South Point defenders, Sadler somehow found an exit and loped into the end zone for a 38yard run to put Ashbrook up 7-0.

Cook made it 14-0 late in the second quarter on a play that typified the way things went for South Point. On third-and-9 from the Raider 11, Ashbrook quarterback Mike Hatten fumbled the snap.

though, and Hatten was able to pick it up and complete an option toss to Cook for the score.

The fumble was one of three on the night for the Green Wave all of which were recovered by Ashbrook.

"They've got some great athletes over there," South Point's John Devine said of Ashbrook. "They were more alert than we were tonight. They made the plays and we didn't."

An Ashbrook score just before halftime, a 60-yard run by Sadler for his second touchdown of the game, gave the Green Wave a 21-0 lead at the break.

Two third-quarter scores put the game on ice. Ashbrook tackle (yes, tackle) Joe Hageman tallied his second touchdown of the year on a fumble recovery in the end zone with 3:52 left in the third, and Hatten (4-of-6 for 148 yards) connected with wideout Matt Buswell on a well-thrown 46-yard sideline bomb just over a minute later that made it 34-0.

"(Mike) Hatten throws the ball well," said Ashbrook coach Bill Eccles. "That's one of the strengths of this team."

The Red Raiders, on the other hand, were forced to find solace in being the first team to break through against the Ashbrook defense:

South Point quarterback Devon Lowery and running back Jeremy Jackson helped lead the Raiders from their own 45 to the Ashbrook 16, where Wright drilled a 31-yarder through the unrights as time expired.

"Ashbrook did a tremendous job on defense tonight." Devine said. "They shut down our running game, and we couldn't get anything going on offense. We just didn't execute."

The Raiders will get a chance to bounce back mext week against winfess Hunter Huss, and Ashbrook takes its show on the road for the first time for a contest at Lincolnton.
