### South Point claims conference title in a barnburner

In one of the highest-scoring games ever played in Gaston County, South Point ended Kings Mountain's three-year reign as conference champions with a spirited 56-52 win.

Neither team could stop the other until South Point's defense finally shut the door on Kings Mountain in the fourth quarter.

"I've never been involved as a coach or player in a game with so

much offense," said South Point coach John Devine. "And Prep then it was defense football that rose to the occasion when it counted."

The win kept South keeps playoff Point unbeaten at 10-0 hopes alive. and 5-0 in the SWC with one regular sea-

son game remaining. Kings Mountain (5-4-1, 3-2) was eliminated from post-season play.

"I've said all week that to be the champions we have to beat the champions," said Devine. "And we barely did.'

Kings Mountain senior Anthony Hillman was unstoppable for most of the game, running for 249 yards and five touchdowns. But every time the Mountaineers powered their way downfield, the Raiders responded with their version of high-powered

Jeremy Jackson rushed for 136 yards and a touchdown, quarterback Devon Lowery ran for 135 yards and four touchdowns and threw two touchdown passes to Jarien Jackson.

Jarien Jackson ran for 86 yards and added a 50-yard touchdown run to his two scoring catches.

I have to give all the credit to Devon Lowery," said Jarien Jackson. "Whatever Devon saw he took. He worked hard all night and he did an amazing job getting the ball to me (on the TD passes). He got the ball to me, and I knew I had to catch it.'

Jarien Jackson had been involved in that kind of game many times before.

"Lots of them," he said. "And I lost every one of them. This is what I've been playing my whole life for.

The Mountaineers, who won the coin toss but deferred taking the kickoff until the second half. broke a 28-28 halftime tie after taking the second half kickoff.

South Point fumbled on the ensuing drive, and the Mounties scored again to take a 40-28 lead.

The Raiders kept the pace and Lowery's touchdown with 8:24 left in the third quarter brought South Point back within a touchdown.

Lowery scored the final touchdown that put the game away with 1:47 left to play.

"Anthony Hillman is a great running back, but we knew he could be stopped," said South Point linebacker Ian Gibson. "When we fell behind by two touchdown, the defense knew we had to stop them.

"We together in the huddle and we decided that we wanted it more than they did. The defense had to put the game away.
