■ Red Raiders cap first unbeaten season since 1984

RUTHERFORDTON — South Point survived a scare from R-S Central to finish the regular season unbeaten for the first time since 1984.

The Red Raiders trailed 9-6 at halftime, then scored 10 unanswered points in the second half for a 16-9 victory. South Point, the Southwestern 3A champion with a 6-0 league mark, is 11-0 overall. The Raiders will host a first-round state playoff game next Friday.

"It was an ugly win," said South Point coach John Devine. "We walked through the first half and pulled it out in the second half. R-S Central had a good game plan. I'm just glad to get out of here with a win."

South Point was without leading rusher Chris Stowe, who was sidelined with an ankle injury. But Tiger Williams did just fine in Stowe's place. The junior rushed for a careerhigh 102 yards and had an interception in the first half.

The Raiders appeared to pick up where they left off a week earlier in their high-scoring shootout against Kings.

R-S Central (2-8, 1-5) got its first break when Chris King blocked a Jarien Jackson punt at

the South Point 5 and the ball rolled through the end zone for a safety.

After South Point's free kick, the Hilltoppers marched 53 yards for the go-ahead touchdown when Marcus Godfrey scored on a 1-yard plunge.

South Point finally mounted a scoring drive early in the third quarter as the Raiders marched 81 yards in 12 plays with Lowery scoring from the 2 with six minutes left in the

third.

Michael Wilkinson, who missed earlier field-goal attempts from 28 and 23 yards, split the uprights from 32 yards for the finishing touch with 3:46 left in the game.

Lowery ran for 97 yards for South Point, but only completed one of 11 passes for 14 yards.

Godfrey led R-S Central with 69 yards, and quarterback Jeff Ogle completed six of 11 passes for 62 yards.
