Brown scores six TDs as Red Raiders roll over Wonders

BELMONT — After watching his Red Raiders put a 56-17 whipping on Kannapolis A.L. Brown Friday night at Lineberger Stadium, South Point head coach John Devine was wearing quite a smile.

It was about as wide as some of the holes his offensive line opened to propel fullback Joe Brown loose for six touchdowns, the second-best scoring performance in Gaston County history.

"That's about as satisfied as I've been in a long time," Devine said. "They're a good football team and they've got some good athletes. We just took the wind out of them."

South Point (3-0) played typical Red Raider football, running over and through the A.L. Brown defense at will.

"We're not going to be too fancy, but we're going to come at you." Devine said. "We're not going to run east and west. We've got a good offensive line that will get down there and get dirty. They'll go after you."

After holding the Wonders to a field goal on the first drive of the game, South Point got a 94-yard kickoff return from Brandon Reid to take a 7-3 lead.

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From that point, Brown and the Red Raider offensive line took over as the 6-foot-1, 195pound junior scored five times from inside the 5-yard line before reeling off a 44-yarder in the fourth quarter.

With his 36-point performance, surpassed only by the 47 points Stanley's Charlie Handsel hung on Cherryville in 1955. Brown has now scored 13 touchdowns in only three games, putting him on pace to score 260 points for the season, a total that would easily surpass the current county singleseason scoring record of 200 points, set by South Point's Scott Crawford in 1971.

"I know when we get down there close, I've got to be the man, but I've got five people in front of me," Brown said of his offensive line. "They did a great job tonight."

Even though he was proud of his touchdowns from close range, the run he was happiest with was the 44-varder, which gave the Red Raiders a 49-10 lead with 8:29 left in the game.

"I felt better doing that than just knocking it in from 1 yard out," said Brown, who finished the night with 107 yards on 15 carries. "Long runs like that make you better."

Devine was pleased with his team's execution, especially in

The victory avenged South Point's 33-30 loss in Kannapolis last season, something Brown was proud of.

"We owed them something from last year," Brown said. "But we want to play like we owe everybody something."

Wonders coach Ron Massey who previously coached at Kings Mountain, thinks his team has some fight left, despite getting off to a 1-2 start.

"We're not giving up on this team," Massey said. "People might want to get rid of me. but these kids are going to bounce back. We'll find some ways to win football games."

A.L. Brown faces Concord next week while the Red Raiders travel to Crest.
