With playoffs on line, Williams delivers

South Point overcomes 10-point deficit in second half, advances

BELMONT — With his team trailing by four points early in the fourth quarter, South Point's Javar Williams decided to take matters into his own hands.

The junior quarterback orchestrated a brilliant scoring drive to give the Red

Raiders their first lead of the game 37 SOUTH POINT with 9:17 remain-27 ing and later

scored the back-

breaker as South Point secured a 37-27 playoff win over Franklin here at - Lineberger Stadium.

The second-round victory launches the Red Raiders (11-1) to the 3A state quarterfinals, where they will face Mooresville, a 27-21 winner over Ragsdale.

- South Point's go-ahead touchdown drive early in the fourth quarter covered 89 yards and included a 55-yard run by Williams, who made several tackle-breaking spin moves to give the Red Raiders excellent scoring position at the Franklin 23-vard line.

Two plays later, Williams ran for a 12yard gain to set up Brian McWhirter's 13vard scoring run. Andrew Rinehart's point-after-touchdown kick gave the Red

Raiders a 23-20 lead.

After Franklin unsuccessfully tried a fake punt on its ensuing possession, the Red Raiders took over at the Panther 17vard line.

Williams needed only two carries to reach the end zone and give South Point an insurmountable 30-20 lead with 7:45 remaining.

"Javar Williams has turned into an allstate player," South Point coach John Devine said. "He is a tremendous talent. He took control of that game. When we had to have it and we needed a play, he wanted the ball.

"That's all you can ask of a quarterback.

Williams finished with 115 vards and a touchdown on 24 carries. He also completed 6 of passes for 95 yards and an in-

terception well as Williams played down the stretch, Franklin (11-2) still had a chance to win late in the game.

In fact, it was Williams who fumbled on South Point's own 25-yard line at the 3:07 mark to give Franklin a chance.

Five plays later, Franklin scored on an 8-yard pass from Clay Wyatt to Dustin Penland. It was the second time Wyatt connected with Penland for a touchdown and this one cut South Point's lead to 30-27 with 2:48 on the clock.

But Franklin's onside kick attempt didn't travel the 10 yards necessary for the Panthers to recover the ball, and South Point took possession at the Franklin 48.

The Red Raiders needed only one play to end the night on a dramatic note as junior fullback Joe Brown bursted up the middle and covered all 48 vards for his third touchdown of the night.

"If it got any more exciting; I don't know if I could have stood it," Devine said. "I'm telling you, it was a great effort. Tremendous character. We talked about being behind not giving up. We talked about the character it takes to a win a championship, and you saw of that some tonight.

South Point, making its fourth consecutive appearance in the second round of the state playoffs, trailed by as many as 10 in the second half before mounting the late comeback;

Franklin took advantage of several big plays to build a 14-3 lead in the second quarter. The Panther's opened the scoring on a 78-yard pass from Wyatt to Penland.

They struck again when a 37vard run by Josh Durm set up a 14-yard scoring pass from Wyatt to Brandon Church. That gave the Panthers a 14-3 lead with 7:33 left in the second quarter.

South Point closed the gap just before halftime when Williams completed three consecutive passes to set up a 1-

vard touchdown run by Joe Brown. Franklin led 14-10 at the break.

Franklin capitalized on a South Point mistake in the third quarter to extend its lead to 10. Williams made a low pitch to Tyler Gorton deep in South Point territory. Franklin's Kyle Ledford recovered the loose ball in the endzone to give the Panthers a 20-10 lead with 9:47 remaining in the third

After South Point scored on a 27-yard Brown run to make the score 20-16. Franklin threatened to extend its lead to start the fourth quarter.

But the Panthers' drive stafled on the South Point 10 when Jeremiah Riddle intercepted a Wyatt pass at the goal line and returned it 11 vards

Williams then led the Red Raiders on their go-ahead

"It's hard." Franklin coach Fred Goldsmith said. "About two-thirds of this game we had it under control. We had a real good opponent. They were well coached, a class team and stayed right in there. They didn't give up, and when we made mistakes, they capitalized.

South Point rolled up 428 yards of total offense despite four turnovers. Franklin produced 340 yards of total of fense

Brown, the area's leading rusher and scorer, finished with 86 yards and three touchdowns on eight carries. Brian

McWhirter carried 12 times for 92 yards and a touchdown.

Chris Durm led the Panthers with 93 yards on 11 carries. His brother, Josh Durm, added 86 yards on 17 carries. Wyatt was 11 of 31 passing with one interception and 191 yards Penland finished with five re ceptions for 127 yards and two scores.
