Three plays later, Brian Bradshaw picked off another Howard pass and returned it 24 vards for the defense's third touchdown

After 12 minutes of play. South Point led 35-0.

The Red Raiders scored three more touchdowns in the first half on runs by Joe Brown, Williams, and Josh Robinson to lead 56-0. In an effort to rest many of

the starters, Devine pulled Williams and Co. with about three minutes to go in the second quarter.

South Point outgained Berry Academy 430-4 on the ground.
