# South Point blasts first-year Berry Academy

## Eleven touchdowns give homecoming crowd added treat

BELMONT — South Point put on a show Friday night that further cemented the Red Raiders' claim as the best team in Gaston County.

With a punishing defense and relentless ground attack, South Point handed first-year Berry Academy its worst loss in a 76-6 rout at Lineberger Stadium. It was an offensive and defensive clinic that had the homecoming crowd wondering just how many points the Red Raiders could put on the scoreboard.

The win moved South Point to 8-1 overall and 5-0 in the Big South 3A Conference. Berry Academy dropped to 0-8 and 0-5.

"We didn't have a great week of practice and were fortunate not to have Ashbrook or Forestview this week," South Point coach John Devine said. "I'm not going to let up this week, because we have to keep getting better and better to achieve our ultimate goals."

South Point's defense started

the scoring early.

On Berry's first play from scrimmage, quarterback Reggie Howard dropped back to pass and hit a wide-open Jordan Gilmore.

The only problem was that Gilmore plays for the Red Raiders. Gilmore returned the interception 30 yards for the first of 11 South Point touchdowns.

On Berry's second play, Howard dropped back to pass again. This time he hit a wide-open Ivey Watson — another Red Raiders defender — who returned the interception 20

yards for a score.

With a 14-0 lead, Red Raiders quarterback Javar Williams finally led the offense. Five plays later, Williams dropped a perfectly thrown ball into the arms of receiver Wade Harris from 13 yards out to make the score 21-0.

The Red Raiders' defense returned to the field and found itself up three touchdowns halfway through the first quarter.

Three plays later, Brian Bradshaw picked off another Howard pass and returned it 24 yards for the defense's third touchdown.

After 12 minutes of play, South Point led 35-0.

The Red Raiders scored three more touchdowns in the first half on runs by Joe Brown, Williams, and Josh Robinson to lead 56-0.

In an effort to rest many of the starters, Devine pulled Williams and Co. with about three minutes to go in the second quarter.

South Point outgained Berry Academy 430-4 on the ground.

Brown rushed for 89 yards on 11 carries with a touchdown. Jamari Crawford gained 68 yards on five carries with a touchdown. Williams had 64 yards on three carries and a touchdown, and Cameron McGlenn added 63 yards and a touchdown on four carries.
