Raider uprising

South Point controls battle of Big South rivals

GASTONIA—Ashbrookfumbledthefirst snap from scrimmage and things didn't get much better in a 58-22 loss to South Point Fridayat William N. Eccles Field.

The Red Raiders (5-3, 3-0 Big South) took advantage of the miscue and scored on three of their first four possessions to put the Green Wave in an early hole from which they couldn't climb out.

"I was really surprised and disappointed," said Ashbrook coach Greg Hill. "I really thought we would play them tooth and nail. We took a buttkicking tonight." Troy Leeper had touchdowns runs of 1 and 26 yards while Dayton Rogers locked a 28-yard field goal with 2:59 in the first quarter to give South Point a 17-0 advantage.

"We really expected a backyard brawl," said South Point coach John Devine. "Our kids had their jaws set and we knew (Ashbrook) would play hard. Things didn't go their way early and it just mushroomed on them. We feel very fortunate we came out on top."

In Ashbrook's first five possessions of the game, the Green Wave punted three times, suffered a pair of turnovers and managed just 16 yards of total offense.

The only bright spot of the first half for Ashbrook (2-6, 2-1 BS) was the play of Angelo Crawford, who didn't carry the ball a single time a week ago against North Gaston yet rushed for 98 yards on six attempts including a 68-yard touchdown. He finished with 114 yards.

Crawford's run pulled the Green Wave to within ten points of South Point, momentarily.

The Red Raiders countered with another touchdown late in the first half when Devan Robbins jaunted 28 yards to make the score 23-7.

South Point dominated the second half with 28 unanswered points before Bryan Jackson returned a kickoff 84 yards for Ashbrook.

"We were focused this week and did a good job of preparing the kids," Devine said. "They did a good job of executing and I thought they played hard for four quarters."

Ontarius Warren added a late touchdown for the Green Wave on a one-yard run.

Leeper had a second half touchdown for the Red Raiders, Tyler Bray scored a pair and Patrick Trusedale and Mitchell Painter one each.

Bray led South Point with 114 yards rushing, Leeper had 91 and Robbins 98.
