Running Wild

QB, Red Raiders show diversity in big victory over Ashbrook

BELMONT — Every team that prepares for South Point High's football team this year knows it has to stop Red Raiders' fullback Troy Leeper.

That included Ashbrook entering Friday's homecoming game at South Point

Leeper had another good night, but it was his quarterback, Patrick Home, who left the opposing coach most impressed after the Red Raiders rolled up 416 yards in a 56-7 victory.

"We felt we had to control 44 (Leeper) and 7 (Horne)," Ashbrook coach Greg Hill said. "That 7 just killed us tonight. He really makes that thing go for them and he did a great job tonight."

South Point improved to 7-0 overall and 3-0 in the Big South 3A Conference after a week in which Home and Red Raiders coach Mickey Lineberger said they prepared for Ashbrook (3-3, 1-2) to try and take away Leeper.

"We worked all week long about taking what they gave us," Horne said. "We know Troy is a great back for us, but we also know we have to find other way. The way our line blocked


tonight, we had all sorts of ways to be effective on offense."

Leeper, the quickest 1,000-yard rusher in county history, had a productive 47 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries.

But Home and wingbacks Devan Robbins and Tyler Bray ripped the Green Wave defense time and again as South Point scored on the opening locked and seven different offensive plays.

Robbins got the homecoming win off to a fast start by running back the opening kickoff 95 yards for the game's first score.

He later added TD runs of 15 and 24 yards to finish with 151 all-purpose yards — 56 of it rushing on just four carries.

Bray had 107 yards and one touchdown in 11 carries. And Home finished with a careerhigh 159 yards and two touchdowns in 16 carries.

"Going into the football game, we wanted to show we had more than one or two weapons," Lineberger said. "Our wingbacks hadn't been touching it very much and we've got some guys who can make plays if they get their handson the ball. We kind a felt like we'd have to use Troy as a decoy coming into tonight."

Hill said his team was prepared to stop Leeper's effective dive plays but struggled slowing Horne's keepers or pitches.

"Leeper wasn't the issue for us tonight," Hill said. "We never defended the bubble all night. Our kids were confused by that all night long. That's why I felt like I let our kids down. I've got to do a better job preparing them."

Ashbrook did manage to have some effectiveness on offense as the Green Wave rolled up 287 yards total offense and 20 first downs. But Ashbrook tallied only once
