Red Raiders rout N. Gaston

BELMONT — Most high school football coaches hate having their off week late in the season.

Not only does it ruin their practice routine, some think the 14 days off makes their teams rusty. Not South Point.

Not by a wide margin after the Red Raiders rolled to a 49-0 win over visiting North Gaston on Friday night.

"The open date was good to us," said South Point coach Mickey Lineberger, whose team improved to 9-0, 5-0 entering next Friday's Big South 3A Conference championship showdown at Crest. "That first half was the best half of football we've played all year."

The Red Raiders, who will be seeking their 19th league title and sixth in a row next week, scored on their first six possessions to take a 42-0 halftime lead.

After kneeling out the end of the first half, the Red Raiders scored again on the first possession of the second half before substituting liberally the rest of the way.

The only suspense left was whether or not a North Gaston offense that had been effective in other games this season moving the football would be able to break the Red Raiders' shutout.

The Wildcats (1-9, 0-6), who dropped their 31st straight Big South contest, reached South Point territory once in each half, but were turned away without points each time.

"We didn't play our best game of the year obviously," North Gaston coach Mike Patton said. "But give South Point credit. They're a really good team and they played like we expected them to."

The shutout was South Point's first since a 63-0 win over Clover, S.C., to open the 2011 season and it was the Red Raiders' first league shutout since winning 63-0 at North Gaston in 2009.

"I was really, really proud of our defense," Lineberger said. "They'd been keeping the ball away from people all year, but we did a good job stopping them."

South Point's efficient offense rolled up 374 yards total offense, with Tyler Bray leading the way with 119 yards rushing and four touchdowns in 14 carries. Devan Robbins added 77 yards and a touchdown in six tries and Jaquan Brooks completed two touchdown passes on both of his pass

attempts to Jeffrey Pearsall.

The defense limited North Gaston to Wildcats' seasonlows of 125 yards total offense and 99 yards rushing.

Daishon Davis had eight solo or first-hit tackles, including two for losses, and Donnie Hunter and Deion Jones had six apiece. Nimar Smith recovered two fumbles, Jones and Tanner Muse one each and Donovan Stowe and Richard Dunning each had pass interceptions.

"All you can say, really, is that our kids executed their game plan well — on both sides of the ball," Lineberger said.
