Dominant D helps Chargers end streak against South Point

BELMONT — None of the Creat players had

foot eight in a row against South Point and neither had fifth-year head couch Mark Barnes,

But the winders not against the Bed Raiders

had haumted the Chargers program as a whole
since 2006, and that dirought ended in a big way
with a thorough 15-13 whipping on opening
right Priday at Limberger Stackum.

"We played the best game that we have
played against them in a long time." Barnes

said. "We got some breaks tonight. They turned

the ball over, we got them in some long yardage
situations and got them out of their element."

Crest's defensive front dominated all night
and the Chargers (1-4) scored on their first
three possession, sending a clear message
this would be their night.

Tre Harbison rushed for 95 yards and three
touchdowns and Willie Green II passed for
148 yards and two touchdowns to lead a Crest
offense that gained 271 yards despite three
second-half fembles. Tyshun Odom caught
both TD passes, one covering 85 yards and
the other a six-yarder.

But the game ball belonged to a defense that disrupted South Point's triple-option offense from the beginning, holding the Red Raiders to 141 yards. South Point quarterback Jaquan Brooks, who rushed for 153 yards and a touchdown in last season's 35-16 win, managed a measly two yards on 15 carries.

"We were just being aggressive and cohesive," Crest outside linebacker and senior captain Jaleel Feaster said. "Just making sure that we try to get to the ball every play and play aggressive."

Justin Foster joined Feaster at outside linebacker. The inside linebackers were Aaron Ramseur and Malik Hopper, and the defensive front was made up of Jared Brooks, Omar Brooks and Chris Willis.

South Point junior fullback Ryland Etherton had a decent night in his varsity debut, rushing for 93 yards on 24 carries, but the rest of the team provided only 48 yards.

"We dominated the line of scrimmage I thought tonight, especially when they had the ball," Barnes said. "We could play the dive, we could play the quarterback and we got them out of rhythm, and we've never been able to do that to them before."

The game marked South Point's first opening-night loss since 2010, the year before Mickey Lineberger took over as head coach. The program lost for only the fourth time during Lineberger's tenure, dropping to 35-4.

"Adversity sort of reveals character and we're going to see how we react under these adverse conditions," Lineberger said. "It wasn't one guy, it wasn't two guys, it was the whole team."

Crest's last win in the series came in 2006. South Point's eight straight wins after that including a playoff victory in 2012.

The game began 37 minutes late because of an officials' scheduling error. Officials didn't show up until just before 8, and the game kicked off at 8:07 after each team was allowed to stretch on the field again.
