South Point rolls to second straight victory

BELMONT — South Point High football Mickey Lineberger felt his team relaxed some in the second half of Monday's continuation of a 47-10 win over visiting North Gaston.

But the Red Raiders played so well early on, it was hard for Lineberger to be too critical. "We had a real good first half," said Lineberger, whose team led 20-3 early in the second quarter Friday before lightning suspended the game until Monday. "If you take Friday night and tonight's first 10 minutes, it was about as good as we can play.

"Then we sort of relaxed in the third quarter. I was disappointed in that because we're trying to make sure we're playing our best at the end of the season."

South Point (6-4, 5-1) gets another chance to do just that when it visits nearby Stuart Cramer in the first-ever varsity football meeting between the two schools on Friday night.

"We're getting better and we're getting healthier," said Lineberger, whose team's only league blemish came in a 34-31 overtime loss to Forestview two weeks ago.

On Monday, South Point got 250 all-purpose yards from senior Tanner Muse and quarterback Jaquan Brooks directed a 415-yard offense. Muse picked up 143 yards rushing and two touchdowns in five carries, returned a kickoff 98 yards and returned a punt nine yards. For good measure, he also

Lineberger said of Muse, the 6-foot-4, 218-pound defensive back and wingback who has committed to play at Clemson next season. "The game just comes easy to him."

Brooks rushed for 95 yards and two touch-downs and added 26 yards passing. Ryland Etherton and Ben Washam also had TD runs for the Red Raiders.

For North Gaston (3-7, 1-5), quarterback Ethan Wiggins rushed for 99 yards and passed for 18 more in the Wildcats' 203-yard offensive attack. North Gaston scored on Christian Stewart's 36-yard field goal and Brandon Stowe's 30-yard wingback pass to Jaleel Daniels.

"I thought they did what they normally do," said Wildcats coach Mike Patton, who was a South Point assistant before returning to his high school alma mater three seasons ago. "We had a game plan for them, but we didn't execute it. Against a team tapped a loose ball headed out of bounds back into the field for a South Point fumble recovery.
