
Red Raiders achieve playoff shutout

South Point heading to state championship game

LENOIR — South Point's turnaround season is now only one win shy of its goal after the Red Raiders recorded a dominating 26-0 win at Hibriten on a frigid Friday night at Jeff Storie Memorial Stadium.

South Point (11-4), which started the season 1-3 and 2-4, has won nine straight games behind a crunching defense and an efficient offense.

Both were on display in Friday's dominating victory on a night in which temperatures dipped into the 30s.

The Red Raiders rolled up 396 yards and 17 first downs on offense and limited an offense that had averaged 50.3 points per game to no points, 120 total yards and kept the previously unbeaten Panthers (14-1) without a first down until 7:58 remained in the third quarter.

"I can't say enough about how our defense has improved this year," said South Point coach Mickey Lineberger, whose team recorded its fifth shutout of the season and third in the playoffs. "But a lot of that is our offense keeping them off the field by executing as well as they've been

executing."

South Point plays in its sixth state title game next Saturday at 11:05 a.m. in the N.C. High School Athletic Association Class 3A title game at Wake Forest's BB&T Field against Eastern champion Rocky Mount in a rematch of last season's N.C. 3A title game.


Rocky Mount advanced with a 34-33 triple overtime win over Havelock.

Previously, the Red Raiders shared the 1971 Western N.C. Activities Association title before winning NCHSAA titles in 1979 (3A), 2003 (3A) and 2009 (3AA). Last year is South Point's lone championship game loss, coming in overtime by a 24-21 score to Rocky Mount.

Friday's victory at Hibriten was, in essence, determined in the first six minutes of the game.

South Point took the opening kickoff and drove 70 yards in nine plays, capped by Scottie Lee's 30-yard touchdown pass to Ray Grier.

Then after the teams traded turnovers in the next four plays, South Point line-backer Nate Hamilton and others snowedunder Hibriten 1,000-yard rusher McKinley Witherspoon for a safety that gave the Red Raiders a 9-0 lead with 6:32 left in the opening quarter.

But South Point was hardly done.

Lee's 5-yard TD keeper and Thomas Lempereur's 21-yard field goal made it 19-0 at the half. And Jake Alexander capped a 14-play, 88-yard drive with a 3-yard TD run that came after the Red Raiders had stopped Hibriten on downs at the 12.

Lee (153 yards passing and 84 yards rushing) and Alexander (139 yards rushing) led the South Point offense, with Leethrowing 18 passes, which was just four off a season high for the Red Raiders. Nick Muse caught six of Lee's 10completions for 92 yards.


"They were giving us some stuff" in the passing game, Lineberger said. "And we're going to take what they're going to give us."

Perhaps just as importantly, South Point ran 65 offensive plays to 39 for Hibriten, which had two 1,000-yard rushers and a quarterback with more than 800 yards passing this season.

"Welost 24 seniors," Lineberger said. "And our JV team won one football game last year. So this speaks volumes about how hard these kids have worked and how hard these coaches have coached this season."

Matthew Robinson's eight solo or first-hit tackles led the South Point defense, with Muse and Phillip Davis adding four stops each.
