1-ranked South Point rolls past East Rutherford

BELMONT — South Point set a school record for consecutive wins Friday night in a 55-7 homecoming win over East Rutherford that looked a lot like many of their previous wins in a streak that began in the middle of last season.

It's because much of the Red Raiders' current 18-game winning streak has followed a similar script: Get ahead early, force the opponent into mistake after mistake and use a balanced offense to take an easy victory.

"We're always looking to improve," first-year South Point coach Adam Hodge said. "And we improved some more tonight but we know we have to keep getting better."

The Red Raiders improved to 8-0 overall and 2-0 in the Southwestern Athletic Conference as the No. 1 ranked N.C. 2Ateam in the state surpassed the 17-game winning streak of South Point teams in the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

The Red Raiders' longest unbeaten streak is 22 games from 1970 to 1972 but South Point had two ties in that streak, including one that snapped a 14-game winning streak.

South Point's current 18-game winning streak is the longest in county history while old Mount Holly High has the longest unbeaten streak 1966 to 1968) that started with a 10-game winning streak.

East Rutherford (5-3, 1-1) was regarded as the prime league challenger to defending state champions South Point and Shelby.

But the Red Raiders roared to a 41-0 lead by late in the first half before cruising to the win.

Ray Grier caught three passes - all for touchdowns for 88 yards to lead a 390-yard offense. Keaton Hale (77 yardsrushing with one touchdown, 28 yards passing with one touchdown), Jake Alexander (75 yards rushing), Scottie Lee (60 yards passing with two touchdowns, 23 yards rushing and one touchdown) and Naseem Jones (66 yards rushing, one touchdown) also had big nights for an offense that got a late touchdown from Jacob Alexander.

South Point's defense also was balanced as well as producing a touchdown on Tre

Glenn's 20-yard fumble return. Glenn and Nathan Hamilton led the way with nine solo or first-hit tackles apiece.

Hamilton had three for losses with a caused fumble, a pass interception and a pass break-up. Nick Gange (five tackles) and Mario Brandon, Jr. (four tackles, fumble recovery) were other defensive standouts.

The only worries for the Red Raiders were the repeated hard hits that quarterback Scottie Lee and fullback Jake Alexander keep taking. Lee left the game in South Point's first series with a sore back and he and Alexander were given time off for much

of the second half.

"When you run as hard as they run, you're going to take some hits," Hodge said. "We gave them some time off tonight."

South Point now visits R-S Central and Chase before the much-anticipated regular season home finale with Shelby on Nov. 3.

"The goal is to get better each week and peak at the right time," Hodge said. "We're still working to get there."
