




Earl Lingafeldt is a 1963 graduate of Drexel High School. He received his A and BS degree in health and physical education at Lenoir-Rhyne college in '66.

While at Lenoir-Rhyne, Earl lettered in football as an outstanding lineman for four years and was named to the All-Conference and All-District college teams during his junior and senior seasons.

After graduating from L-R, he came to Belmont as an assistant coach in charge of the line, a position he still holds on the football staff. The Red Raider linemen are aggressive because Lingafeldt himself was and still is aggressive.

In girls basketball, where Lingafeldt has been the head coach since '69, his teams have compiled a winning percentage of over .800 and have been the scourge of the Southwestern 3-A Conference.

He coached back-to-back WNCHSAA championship girls basketball teams in '72-'73 and '73-'74. He sent five straight teams to the WNCHSAA finals and has coached two All-Staters, Shirle Hart and Beth Beaty. His green sophomores finished fourth in the always-tough SWC last year and big things may lie ahead for the Red Raiderettes this season.

Lingafeldt coaches the track and field team in the spring. He has been an outstanding slow-pitch softball player for the Carolina A's, the defending North Carolina champion, for several seasons.

Earl and his wife, Mozelle, a Cleveland County native, have one daughter, three-year-old Lori. "She can already score a basket with either hand," smiles the redhead.

























Phil Tate

Phil Tate, "Mister Baseball" in the Southwestern 3-A Conference, is a 1962 graduate of Belmont High School, where he participated in football, basketball and baseball.

He led the Southwestern 3-A Conference in batting as a second baseman for the Red Raiders as a senior with a .384 average.

Phil played baseball at Western Carolina University from 1962-66. He graduated in '67. Tate completed his masters degree at WCU this past summer.

In football, Phil coaches the offensive backs. He coached the backs at Hunter Huss High School in Gastonia in '67 and '68. He came to South Point in '69, and his SP baseball teams have been practically unbeatable since that time.

Tate's baseball teams have won four conference championships (Southwestern 3-A) outright and had two second-place finishes.

Tate's Red Raider team won the WNCHSAA championship back-to-back in '72 and '73. The Big Red finished as the runner-up team in the association this past spring.

Tate is married to the former Trish Forbes of Belmont and they have two daughters, seven-year-old Kristin and four-year-old Ashley.


"My only son," quips Tate, "is a Heinz mutt named, appropriately, 'Homer."

Since Belmont High School and Cramerton High School consolidated to form South Point High School in 1969, several of the Red Raider stars have played in prestigious post-season games.

One of the highest honors a high school senior football player can attain is to be selected to play in the Shrine Bowl football game each December in Charlotte. It pits 35 of the finest North Carolina seniors against a similar group from South Carolina. The attraction benefits the crippled child, and for a player to be chosen to the team is truly a player's dream turned into reality. The East-West football game in Greensboro, played each July during the coaches clinic there, is also a prestigious honor. 


