

During more than 20 years in the daily newspaper field, Dwight Edsel Frady was sympathetic to those competing in the so-called minor sports. He especially found a great delight in featuring girls basketball and softball, providing the teams were worthy of it.


Because of his allegiance to slow-pitch softball, most notably during its zenith and with the monopoly by Pharr Yarns Reds during that time. Frady stories about the sport, in general, and the Reds, in particular, earned him national awards.

Also, because of his dedication to the promotion and excellent reporting of community sports activities in Gaston County, he received the prestigious Pete DiMizio award, winning over a big North Carolina field.


Frady, since stepping into a role as sports reporter at age 18, has contributed immeasurably to the growth of athletics in Gaston County and especially the programs at old Belmont High and South Point over the past quarter of a century.

Undoubtedly, his work has had a lasting impact on some of the young women and men who have gone on to college to continue athletic careers. Over the past several years as editor of The Belmont Banner, he has expanded on his role to include a wide-range of community activities on his 'beat', but always with a slight edge to his first love . . . sports.

He's one of a kind, this genial, energetic, easygoing, dedicated newspaperman and Belmont's most fortunate to lay claim to him.





JIM BIGGERSTAFF

Thirteen years without a losing record. That smacks of football tradition, and Jim Biggerstaff, head football mentor and athletic director at South Point High School, is in his 14th season and has never coached a Big Red team with a losing record.

With the Southwestern 3-A Conference as competitive as it is, that's a remarkable record. In fact, that's an outstanding record for any prep football coach in the state.

Biggerstaff has 105 wins to his credit against only 30 losses and six ties. After a 14-0 record in 1979 and the state 3-A championship, South Point was 5-4-1 in 1980 and 5-5 last year.

Last year's team was 3-5 going into its final two games. The team showed character in coming back to defeat East Rutherford 42-18 and Chase 28-0 and finish at 5-5. In the eighth game, South Point carried Crest, the eventual SWC champion, into overtime before falling, 17-14.

Biggerstaff, who has coached a number of players who have gone on to college stardom, returned "home" to Belmont in 1969. He and his capable staff have worked hard to make football THE game in town every Friday in the communities which encompass South Point High School.

Biggerstaff's teams play an exciting brand of football out of the Power-I, and the Big Red's swarming defensive units over the years have been tough on the opposition's strike force. Biggerstaff recorded his 100th coaching victory in November of 1980 when South Point beat Chase 13-6 at Lineberger Stadium.

Jim, who always gives his assistant coaches and the kids he coaches his thanks for a job well done, is a 1954 graduate of Belmont High School, where he was a star running back on the old Red Raider single wing teams. He was an outstanding baseball player in the spring and a member of the basketball team.


Biggerstaff attended the University of Tennessee during his freshman year in college, playing wingback on the freshman team for the Vols. He transferred to Western Carolina University for his sophomore, junior and senior years, playing fullback for the Catamounts.

After graduating from WCU in 1959, Biggerstaff was Bill Eustler's right hand man for the powerful Rockingham Rockets grid team and Jim was the baseball coach there for 10 years prior to returning to Belmont to take over the helm of the Red Raiders in football and to serve as the school's athletic director.

In 1971, Jim was named the outstanding football coach in North Carolina by the Association of Sports Broadcasters. He was the head coach for the West All-Stars in the 1974 East-West game in Greensboro, which was won by the West. He was an assistant coach in the 1975 Shrine Bowl game at Charlotte's Memorial Stadium, which annually pits the top seniors from North Carolina against a similar group from South Carolina.

Jim, a former Belmont Man of the Year, married his high school sweetheart, the former Joyce Wilson of Belmont. They have two children. They are Jamie, a daughter, who is a senior at Appalachian State University this fall, and a 16-year-old son, Jeff, who is a junior at South Point.

"Catch That Football Fever"



Earl Lingafeldt is a 1963 graduate of Drexel High School. The redhead received his BA and BS degree in health and physical education at Lenoir-Rhyne College in 1966.

While at Lenoir-Rhyne, Earl lettered in football as an outstanding lineman for four years and was named to the All-Conference and All-District college teams during his junior and senior seasons.

After graduating from L-R, Earl came to Belmont as an assistant coach in charge of the line, a position he still holds on the football staff. The Red Raider linemen are always well-schooled in the fundamentals.

In girls basketball, where Lingafeldt has been the head coach since 1969, his teams have compiled a high winning percentage and have had great teams in the Southwestern 3-A Conference. In 1977-78, his Raiderettes finished with a 26-2 record, the best record in Raiderette cage annals . . . dating back to the dirt court high school days in Belmont.

Lingafeldt coached back-to-back WNCHSAA championship girls teams in the cage sport in '72-'73 and 73-'74. He sent five consecutive teams to the WNCH SAA finals and has coached three All-Staters, Shirle Hart, Beth Beaty and Punkie Mills. Mills is a rising junior at East Tennessee State and is considered a potential collegiate Division I All-American.

Lingafeldt two years ago coached both the boys team and the girls team. He coaches girls track and field in the spring. He has been an outstanding slowpitch softball player for the Carolina A's, the powerhouse team of North Carolina for several seasons, and played on a Pharr Yarns Reds national championship team.

Earl and his wife, Mozelle, a Cleveland County native, have two daughters, 8-year-old Lori, a student at Belmont Central, and 3-year-old Leslie.

EARL LINGAFELDT

Phil Tate is a man with the energy of three men. And last year, he had to have that energy because he was not only the defensive coordinator in football, but coached the boys basketball team and the baseball team.

And Tate's baseball teams have been terrors in Southwestern 3-A Conference and state 3-A play over the years, particularly the past two years.

His baseball teams are always well-schooled. In 1980, his Red Raiders won the state 3-A championship at Raider Field with a two-game sweep of Eastern Randolph and finished with a 22-5 record. Last year's team had a near-miss, winning the SWC title, two sudden-death games, and then lost a heartbreaking 8-7 extra-inning game to East Surry on the road. The team finished with a 19-7 record.

In the playoff win over A. C. Reynolds, it was Coach Tate's 100th coaching victory. Tate's teams have won a remarkable seven SWC championships in his 13 years at the helm.

Phil is a 1962 graduate of Belmont High School, where he participated in football, basketball and baseball.

He led the SWC in batting as a second baseman for the Red Raiders as a senior with a .384 average

Tate played baseball at Western Carolina University from 1962-63. He graduated in '67. He completed his masters degree at WCU three summers ago. He coached the backs at Hunter Huss High School in Gastonia in '67 and '68. He came to South Point in '60, and his head all the summer to South Point in


'69, and his baseball teams have been almost unbeatable since that time.

In addition to the six SWC titles and the state 3-A crown, Phil's Raiders won the WNCHSAA cham-pionship back-to-back in '72 and '73.

Tate is also a highly successful American Legion coach, having coached Post 144 to several high finishes over the past few years.

He is married to the former Trish Forbes of Belmont and they have two daughters, 12-year-old Kristin and 9-year-old Ashley.

Tate has coached three All-Staters in baseball . Butch Harris, Karl Witzke and Todd Horne.

Butch Adams is a graduate of Ashley High School in Gastonia and Wofford College. At Wofford, he lettered four years in baseball.

After graduating from Wofford, Butch taught for two years at Humphrey School in Lowell. During that time, he was an outstanding slow-pitch softball performer on world class teams.

Adams is beginning his fifth season at South Point, where he is an assistant coach in football and varsity boys track and field coach. His cindermen have been outstanding.

His 1977 and 1978 Red Raider track and field teams captured the Gaston County Track Meet and the Southwestern 3-A Conference championship. Butch's 1978 track and field team finished third in the state meet in Raleigh after winning the regional title.

It was like old times last year when his track and field team again won the Gaston County Track Meet and the SWC title.

Being the youngest member of the coaching staff at South Point, Butch has developed a deep pride in the overall program of the school.

"Coaching at South Point has been a most enjoyable experience," he said. "When you're surrounded by good people, you're rewarded."

Adams and his wife, Vicki, and 9-year-old son Jason live in Gastonia.

A new addition to the South Point Coaching Staff this year is Charles A. Greene.







THE MAN ON THE PA MIKE

South Point football fans have been accustomed to the voice of Joe Messer, who works the public address system at Red Raider football games. Joe has been doing the PA work for 21 years, first assisting long-time PA Man Roscoe Helton.

"I enjoy handling the PA," said Messer, "and I've got a lot of thanks in my heart for Roscoe, who started me in this business."

Messer, a Belmont High School graduate, has many accomplishments. He was Belmont Man of the Year in 1975. He has coached Little League baseball and junior high basketball. He has officiated basketball and slow-pitch softball games for several years.

Employed by the Belmont Post Office, he has also been very active in Belmont Playmaker productions as an actor, has served as a choir director, was on the advisory committee for 12 years at Belmont Central Elementary, served on the advisory committee at Belmont Junior High.

Messer is presently on the Gaston County CETA Committee. He is also an avid booster of South Point High School athletics.

Joe is currently a member of Park Street Methodist Church. He is married to the former Margaret Puckett. They have four daughters, Lynn, Terri, Wanda and Barbara.

Messer handles all of the seating arrangements in the press box at Lineberger Stadium--and with all of the media which covers South Point football games-that can be a job in itself.

The voice you are hearing or will be hearing soon tonight--is that of Joe Messer.

Dr. Sam Shaver is a familiar sight on the sidelines and near the South Point bench during the football season at the school.

He is the solidly-built man in the red jacket. He looks like an athlete and South Point's team physician was just that--a star athlete in four different sports in his hometown of Gurden, Ark.

He has been the Big Red team physician "for the love of the sport" for the past 23 years. One of the most coveted trophies in football presented at each year's Big Red Boosters Club All-Sports Banquet is the Dr. Sam Shaver Blocking Trophy.

Dr. Shaver makes the annual presentation himself, and with his witty style is always a big hit during the brief time he is in front of the microphone.


